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MINUTES - Draft

Tuesday, December 21, 2021 Zoom Webinar

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Councilmember Aragon. Agenda was amended to add review of Burien Airport Committee draft workplan.

2. ROLL CALL

3. APPROVE MINUTES

The minutes for the November 16, 2021 Burien Airport Committee (BAC) meeting were approved.

4. BUSINESS AGENDA

a) Update by Representative Tina Orwall on upcoming legislative session and UW Healthy Air, Healthy Schools Study.

Representative Orwall provided an update on the University of Washington Healthy Air, Healthy Schools Study which involved measuring the infiltration of outdoor ultrafine particles into indoor classroom spaces. Data from the Federal Way and Highline School Districts show that about 50% of outdoor ultrafine particles infiltrate indoors. However, if portable HEPA air filters are used in the classroom, those particles can be reduced by 70%. Phase 2 of the study will include some Eastern Washington schools exposed to wildfire smoke. These ultra-fine particles can cause asthma and heart disease. A study on asthma is not likely this legislative session, but possibly next one.

b) SAMP Notice (30 days) and Comment Period (30 days, 45 days, Request for 60 days) StART Meeting Briefing.

A 30-day notice will be provided prior to the issuance of the Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP). There will then be a 30-day comment period, with a longer comment period under consideration. The SAMP is expected in early 2022.

c) Update of StART (SEA Stakeholder Advisory Round Table) activities.

The last StART meeting was held on December 8, 2021, with presentations on the School Resilience to Air Pollution Study and Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act. The next StART meeting is scheduled for February 23, 2022.

The Committee discussed the noise monitoring information collected at Seahurst Elementary School over the summer and inquired if StART could facilitate data analysis on the information collected by the portable and permanent noise monitors.

City Manager Wilson is resigning on January 15, 2022, and Garmon Newsom II, City Attorney, will be his replacement on the Burien Airport Committee, StART, and the Aviation Noise and Federal Policy Working Groups. The City's environmental officials for the SAMP are Susan McLain, Community Development Director, and Nicole Gaudette, Senior Planner.

d) Review of Burien Airport Committee (BAC) draft workplan.

The draft BAC workplan will be further reviewed at the January 18, 2022 BAC meeting. Chair Aragon suggested having the BAC do a presentation to the Burien City Council in February-March 2022 to update them on BAC activities.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

Dave Kaplan, Port of Seattle, commented that City Manager Wilson has been a great advocate for the City of Burien on airport related issues.
