- 1. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 6:02 pm.
- 2. PUBLIC COMMENT: Public comments were part of the presentation on Environmental Justice.
- 3. APPROVE DRAFT MINUTES from June 19, 2018. Minutes from the June 19, 2018 meeting were approved.

4. BUSINESS AGENDA

b. Presentation on Environmental Justice issues related to the Airport.

Millie Piazza, Dept. of Ecology Environmental Justice Coordinator, discussed that there is no state law that must be followed on environmental justice. Often Title VI of the Civil Rights Act on discrimination is the basis for environmental justice issues.

Committee members and guests made introductions and provided comments on airport concerns.

Running Grass, Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 10, Office of Environmental Justice discussed that Executive Order 12898 provides guidance on federal actions to address environmental justice (EJ) in minority/low-income populations. His office works with federal agencies to develop environmental justice plans. A demonstration was given on the "EJ Screen" which is a mapping tool that provides demographic, health, environmental data for specific locations. Running Grass mentioned Interagency Working Groups and National Environmental Justice Advisory Committees (NEJAC) that meet to discuss EJ issues as well as two local EJ projects at Georgetown and Beacon Hill. Some suggestions for helping with our noise/health concerns from the airport include talk to legislators, sue, community benefits agreement with

Port, technical assistance from University of Washington or EPA, and community testimony at upcoming NEJAC meeting.

a. Updates

Larry Cripe of Quiet Skies provided an update on the march they are planning at Alaska Airlines in August, rather than July 26th. They are doing media campaigns and want to keep moving forward with actions to address the noise issues.

The six cities (Burien, Des Moines, Federal Way, Normandy Park, SeaTac, and Tukwila) that are part of the Budget Proviso – Department of Commerce Impact Study have agreed to an allocation method of their share of the \$300,000 match to the Department of Commerce's \$300,000 funding based on population.

A Sea-Tac Stakeholder Advisory Round Table (StART) meeting was held on June 27, 2018.

c. Discuss Outline for Council Resolution on noise impacts.

A handout was provided with potential 'Whereas' clauses for a Burien City Council resolution, with Committee members requested to provide input at a future meeting on who and what should be asked in the resolution.
