Youth Summer Cohort: Digital Marketing and Small Business Development

21-22 Funding: \$35,000

Partnership with the Urban League of Metropolitan Seattle to administer a youth program to teach tangible skills in copywriting, social media marketing, and website design while assisting with the growth of business profiles for the Shop Local Burien website.

15-20 Burien students between the ages of 14-18. Explore career pathways and receive a stipend for participation.

Pre-Apprenticeship Construction Training/Support

21-22 Funding: \$250,000

Investment in the Highline Public Schools Pre-apprenticeship training in the building trades, connecting students with local construction training programs, defining career pathways and providing opportunities for high-paying jobs.

Trains the next generation of workers for the construction industry to build for the future.

Small Business Coaching & Entrepreneurial Support

21-22 Funding: \$45,000

Expands and strengthens economic opportunities for low- and moderate-income persons by strengthening and building microenterprise businesses within low-moderate income communities.
