Citizen Advisory Committee Roles

King County Policy Development Commission (PDC) Sunset 1/1/83

- advisory capacity to assist in planning for land use, transportation systems, utilities, public facilities, recreation, housing, community development, conservation, human services and capital improvements.
- provide effective opportunities for citizen participation in policy-making process of County government.
- collect information, disseminate that information, and encourage citizen participation in government.

Group Health Board of Trustees

- review and set overall policies pertaining to the whole organization
- chair standing committees which make recommendations to the board.

Group Health Standing Committees

- carry out preliminary analyses of issues, within each committee's scope, for action by the board
- recommend policies to the board
- monitor progress of policy implementation.

Metro Citizens' Water Quality Advisory Committee (CWQAC)

Citizens Transit Advisory Committee (CTAC)

- to advise the staff and Council through the Water Quality and Transit Committees, respectively, on the plans and programs proposed in their designated areas.
- identify issues of public concern for council consideration
- monitor and advise metro on its participation program.

City of Seattle/University of Washington Community Advisory Committee

- Advise the Board of Regents and City of Seattle on the orderly physical development of the greater University Area.

SPU/City of Seattle Working Committee

- no formalized agreement approved.
- advise the University and City of Seattle on the development of the University within the North Queen Anne Community.

Policy Advisory Committee - Sea-Tac International Airport

- long-term monitoring and overview of Sea-Tac/Communities Plan Implementation.
- deal with special issues and problems
- make recommendations to King County Executive and Council, Executive Director and Port of Seattle Commission
- initiates actions/recommendations regarding capital programs.

Neighbors Advisory Committee

- monitor redevelopment plans for the T-91 Complex
- make recommendations re: EIS process

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POLICY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Function of the Policy Advisory Committee:

- 1. Long-term monitoring and overview of Sea-Tac Plan implementation
- 2. Deal with special issues and problems
- 3. PAC makes recommendations to King County Executive and the Council, Executive Director and the Port of Seattle Commission
- 4. PAC should be able to initiate actions/recommendations re: capital programs

Composition of the Policy Advisory Committee

- 1. Representative from King County
- 1 Representative selected by Board of P.D.C.
- 2 Representatives from the Port of Seattle (Aviation and Planning and Research Departments)
- Representative from local business *
 (representing Burien Chamber of Commerce, Des Moines C of C and "the strip")
 * should live in area and should be selected by a group meeting
- 1 Representative from the Highline School District
- Representative from local government *
 (representing Des Moines, Tukwila, Normandy Park)
 * should live in the area and should be selected by the combined municipalities
- 1 Representative from the Sea-Tac Airlines
- 4 Citizen representatives selected by the Highline Community Council on a geographic basis from North, South, East and West of Sea-Tac
- 12 Total Representatives

The FAA will be a non-voting member of the Policy Advisory Committee

A representative would serve on a three-year term. Initially, to establish a rotation, members will draw straws for a 2 or 3-year term.

The PAC Chairperson will be selected by the reorganized committee. Staff support will be provided by the Port and County on a yearly basis.

The Sea-Tac Conference Room was recommended for Policy Advisory Committee meetings. Quarterly meetings were endorsed with other meetings being held as necessary.

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
