

Highline Community Council
Meeting of August 12, 1982

Members in attendance: Ken Selander, Joe Breidenbach, Dottie Harper, Ron Nelson, Vivian Matthews, Corleen Perry, Ernie Onorati, Neil Larsen and Karen Verner.

The regularly scheduled meeting was brought to order by Ken Selander, President. Ernie Onorati, Treasurer, reported a balance of \$667.78 in the treasury.

A discussion was held on the proposed incorporation of Highline. President Selander passed out the "Proceedings of the King County Boundary Review Board." Joe Breidenbach and Dottie Harper summarized the progress made so far by the committee in support of Highline's incorporation. It was announced that the Committee for Incorporation would meet again on August 16 and 30.

Dottie Harper reported on a meeting she attended today with the King County Council regarding the proposed Civic Center for the Highline area. The county council voted to go with a senior housing plan instead. She then read a letter from King County Executive Randy Revelle regarding the County Arts Commission and budget.

Vivian Matthews gave an up-date on the Citizens to Save Puget Sound Committee.

Ron Nelson moved that we send a letter of congratulations to Preston Woodall on his appointment to the Metro Council. The motion was seconded and approved.

President Selander appointed Ron Nelson and Corleen Perry to serve on the Greater Highline Community Parks Board.

The September 9 meeting will be held at Sunset Activity Center.

Ron Nelson submitted various newspaper clippings regarding areas and issues of his concern.

Dottie Harper raised the issue of candidates night. Karen Verner proposed that the event be held in October before the General Election rather than for the Primary in September. The motion was seconded and approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 P.M.
