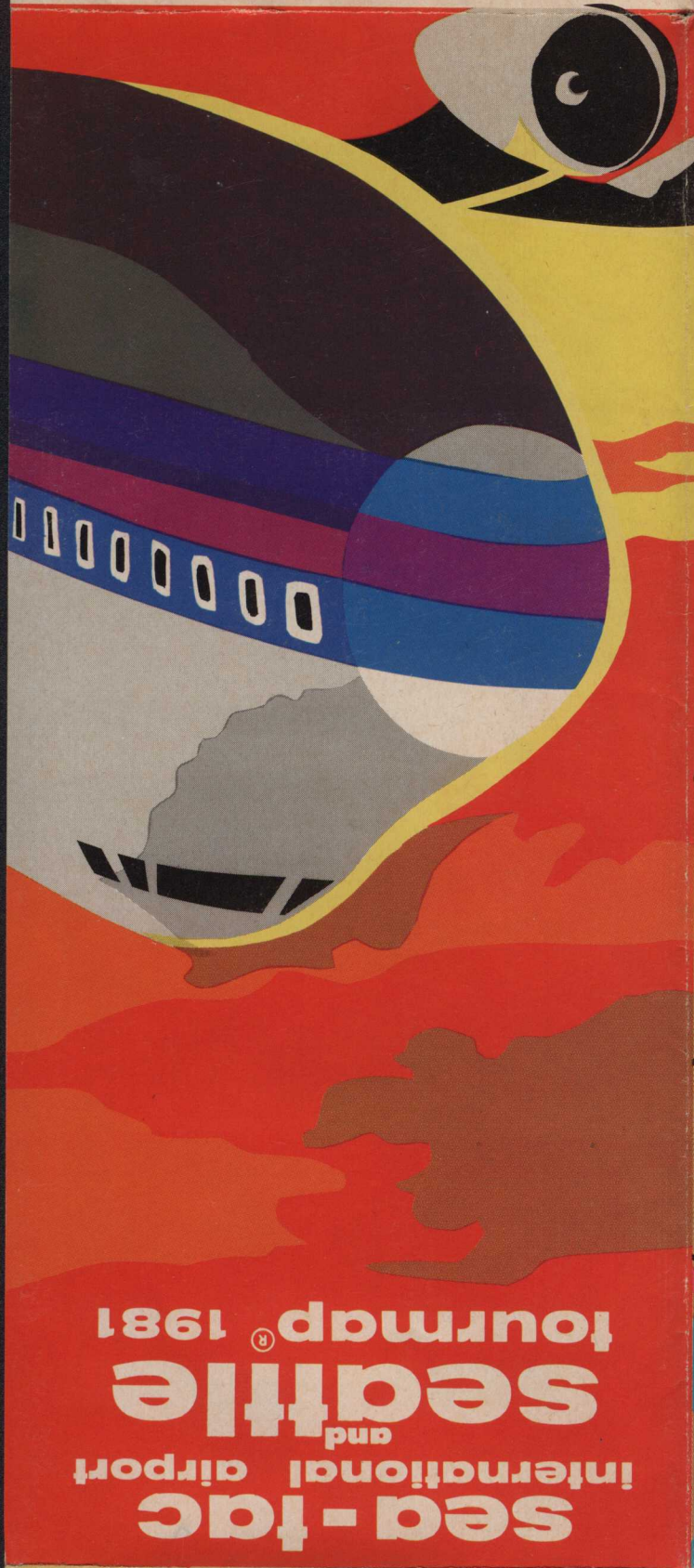

### PASSENGER CHECK-IN

It is always a good idea to call your airline to verify the exact departure time. When the time is confirmed, you are encouraged to check in at least one hour prior to scheduled flight time.

### PARKING

You will be completely under cover once you enter the parking terminal, with skybridges linking you to the main terminal and Sea-Tac's Satellite Transit System which serves both the North and South Satellite buildings. Parking is available at a nominal fee.

### BAGGAGE CLAIM, CABS, BUSES AND RENTAL CARS

On the ground floor of the main terminal, you can claim your luggage at one of the sixteen numbered and designated airline baggage carousels.

Taxicabs are accessible by special telephones located at curbside directly outside of the baggage claim area. Bus and limousine services to Seattle and surrounding communities are available at either end of the passenger terminal on the baggage claim level.

Rental car booths are near the baggage claim area.

All rental cars are picked up and returned on the third floor of the parking terminal.

### LOST AND FOUND/433-5312

Lost baggage should be reported to the airline on which you arrived. For items lost inside the terminal call the number listed above.

### RIDING THE TRAINS

The Satellite Transit System has two separate loops. The south loop begins in the main terminal on the transit level below the TWA counter, with stops at the South Satellite and the end of Concourse B. The north loop begins in the main terminal on the transit level below the United Airlines counter, with stops at the North Satellite and the end of Concourse C.

For your convenience, there is also a shuttle available at the two transit level stations which connects the two loops.

### SERVICE AND CONVENIENCE AROUND THE CLOCK

Sea-Tac International Airport serves as an aerial gateway to major metropolitan areas in the United States and many overseas cities. As one of the nation's most modern and efficient airports, Sea-Tac offers a full range of services to aid travelers, no matter the date or time of day. Restaurants, small shops, duty-free stores, lounges and attractive, comfortable resting areas are but a few of the accommodations at your disposal.

To make your visit safer and more pleasant, Sea-Tac maintains a complete police force and fire department. In addition, a Central Control System takes continuous readings of the temperature inside and outside the airport, of carbon monoxide levels in the parking garage and underground tunnels, and of the water pressure and electrical current in the main utility conduits.

The second floor of the main terminal contains the observation deck, TV area, police headquarters, lost and found, military lounge and chaplain's office.

### SATELLITE TRANSIT SYSTEM

Sea-Tac's completely automated Satellite Transit System is one of the most successful people-movers in the nation. With cars departing from each stop about every two minutes, the STS consists of 9,050 feet of underground railway which connects the main passenger terminal with the North and South Satellites, as well as Concourse B and Concourse C.

### BANKING SERVICES/583-6644

A branch of Seattle-First National Bank is located in the center of the main terminal building. Hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Foreign currency exchange booths are located in the terminal area.

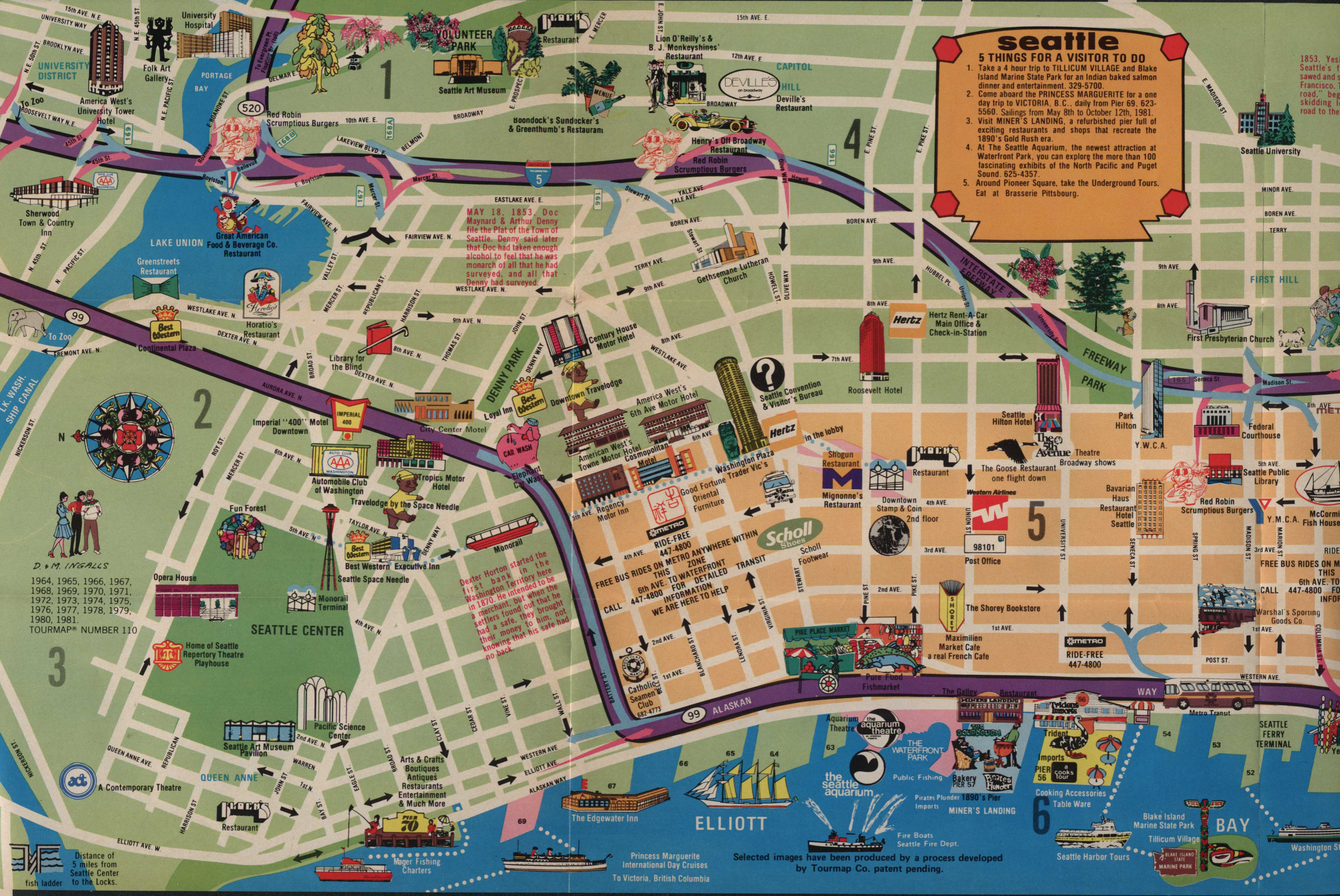
